

FOREST HILL BASEBALL/SOFTBALL
Code of Conduct

1. While at any Forest Hill event, all players, managers, coaches, league officials, parents, umpires, volunteers, and visitors are expected to represent Forest Hill in the highest standards of personal conduct and sportsmanship.

2. Unacceptable conduct or behavior includes the following:
 - a. Profane or abusive language.
 - b. Name calling.
 - c. Racial remarks
 - d. Sexual harassment.
 - e. Fighting.
 - f. Insubordination to those in authority.
 - g. Destruction of Rec Council property or playing fields.
 - h. Gambling on games.
 - i. Alcohol consumption.
 - j. Illegal drug use or possession.
 - k. Cheating, or encouraging the act of cheating.
 - l. Smoking or use of tobacco products.
 - m. Intentional injury of any player, coach, umpire, or spectator.
 - n. Abuse of playing equipment.
 - o. Excessive arguing of calls.

Offenders will be asked to leave the premises. Managers, coaches, players, or other adults affiliated with the league shall be subject to disciplinary action.

3. Hothead rule: There is also a zero-tolerance policy in effect for managers, coaches, players and spectators who berate and disrespect the game officials, opponents, and team members. "Hotheads" can be ejected with no warning. Managers, coaches and players who are ejected from a game must also sit out the next scheduled game. Anyone who is ejected twice will be subject to a Rec Council hearing for the purposes of permanent ejection for the season.
